Poetry Workshop: Poem 2 <u>Monster Poem</u>

THERE'S A LOT TO DESCRIBE ABOUT MONSTERS! MONSTERS INSPIRE ALL THE 5 SENSES: SIGHT, SOUND, TOUCH, TASTE, AND SMELL. HERE'S YOUR CHANCE TO GO "WILD" WITH YOUR STRONG WORD CHOICES.

Create a monster! Draw your monster—it's OK if you're not good at drawing; it's a monster, after all. Then, come up with a theme about your monster—is it a candy monster? A sports monster? A school subject monster? Any theme goes. Then, pick a rhyme scheme and write at least one 10 line stanza describing this thematic monster you created and illustrated <u>using all 5 senses</u>.

Example: "Carl the Surf Monster"

Carl the Surf Monster possesses— Six extremely long hula dresses, Two fabulously flippered feet, Which at surfing are hard to beat. His skin is a smooth as a seal, The fishy aroma is also quite real, Hanging ten he lets out a roar, That sounds a lot like a boar, At bedtime he likes to dine On anything I claim as mine!



This poem will be a part of your Poetry Book. For full credit, you poem needs:

- A consistent rhyme scheme with at least 1 ten line stanza
- A title
- An illustration of the monster
- Strong, descriptive word choices using all 5 senses
- Correct spelling
- Correct formatting (space between stanzas, appropriate punctuation)
